Objectives and Investment Policy

The investment objective of the Fund is to achieve capital growth and generate income (net of fees) over the long term (five years or more) with the generation of income being of secondary importance. There is no guarantee that a positive return will be achieved over five years, or any other period.

The Fund will invest 50-90% in global equities (both directly through transferable securities and indirectly through the use of collective investment schemes). The Fund will pursue its investment objective by constructing an international spread of investments and in any economic sector of the world.

The Fund may also invest in cash, money market instruments, deposits, warrants, fixed income and investment and sub investment grade debt securities (directly and indirectly through the use of collective investment schemes) and gold (indirectly) to attain its objectives. It is not intended that the Fund will have an interest in any immovable property or tangible movable property. The weighting of the investment in each asset may vary as appropriate and there may be times where there is no exposure to some asset classes.

Indirect investment in securities will be achieved by investing in either regulated or unregulated collective investment schemes (CIS), which includes exchange traded funds and investment trusts. The collective investment schemes in which the Fund invests may be managed by either the ACD, the Investment Manager or their associates

The Investment Manager has the power to invest more than 35% in value of the Fund in government and other public securities. This power is restricted to bonds or other securities issued by the governments of the United Kingdom or the United States of America.

Derivatives may be used for efficient portfolio management in accordance with the FCA Rules. The use of derivatives for efficient portfolio management is unlikely to affect the risk profile of the Fund or be utilised frequently.

The base currency of the Fund is pounds sterling.

Income arising from the Fund is distributed to the holders of income units. Investors can buy and sell units on demand when the scheme prices daily at 12 midday.
